- 3. Initiate career development and skill building activities that will prepare students for their future careers.
- 4. Create networking opportunities with St. Mark's career mentors.

What: We are seeking volunteers to come to campus to participate in career presentations and/or career skills workshops.

- 3. Insights from an Industry Expert: Share skills, expectations, trends

After lunch, we can provide opportunities for you to help students learn about internships, summer jobs, and career development skills/strategies if you have time to offer.

Lunch:

All speakers are invited to a special lunch gathering in the Hinkle Room. We will also have a break area with refreshments set up throughout the day.

Attire: Presenters should wear the clothes they normally wear to work.

Lodging:

Follow-up: Participants will receive a confirmation letter with the event details, contact information, and tips for making the day a success.
